




Boatload of Beauties

 good spirit of racing.


He is saddened by the kind of



YACHT OWNERS CAUTION —

When charging batteries DO IT
 RIGHT or look out! Don't attach a
 charger to your boat battery without
 disconnecting the cables. You can
 burn out the alternator, or if done re-
 peatedly, ruin running gear on your
 boat and others near by. This practice
 has been known to electrocute swim-
 mers up to 25 feet away.

Don't use your car battery to boost
 the one in your boat. This can draw a
 spark that could ignite fuel vapors or
 explode battery fumes.

SCCYC CLUBHOUSE UNDER CONSTRUCTION



A permanent clubhouse for South Coast Corinthian YC is now under construction at Marina del Rey.

Scheduled for completion by September 1 of this year, the two story structure will contain 2,400 square feet, and will be subleased by the 150 member YC from 44 Del Rey Corporation, on whose parcel and by whom it is being built.

Lower floor of the clubhouse is designed for use as office space, plus men's and women's heads, showers, and locker facilities. The upper floor will be devoted primarily to social and club membership activities, and will contain a bar and a small kitchen.

A small boat hoist will be a feature of the club, as will a 90-car paved parking area. There will also be 7,500 square feet of outdoor space for dry boat storage.

When completed, the clubhouse will be fully fenced, illuminated, and landscaped. Architect for the building was George Novak. Contractor is I. Weston.

King Harbor YC has supported the North American Championships for the past six years and went all out in 1966 by entering every division and winning both the Men's Mallory and the Women's Adams quarter-finals at Alamitos Bay YC.
