



Leading the 10-meter start in the recent Midwinter Regatta's Saturday race was "Coquille," the famous cutter recently acquired by Staff Commodore Albert Ezor of Del Rey YC at Marina del Rey. Holder of Little America's Cup for 10-meter racers, and first winner (1962) of the California Cup, "Coquille" was the first of fourteen such boats built in Germany around 1930 for members of the Larchmont (N.Y.) YC. Of the original fleet of fourteen, which were sailed across the Atlantic without auxiliary power, six are now owned by West Coast skippers.

CLEVELAND SKIPPERS TO RACE HERE

A contingent of six veteran R boat skippers from the Cleveland Yachting Club, Cleveland, Ohio, will arrive at Los Angeles, Thursday evening, March 2, to race off Marina del Rey against a joint Cal 40-36 Fleet team representing the California Yacht Club March 4 and 5.

The C.Y.C. v. C.Y.C. Team Race series will be sailed in Four Cal 40's and Four Cal 36's, equally divided between the two teams. The skippers and their afterguardsmen will rotate from boat to boat after each race of the scheduled six race series.

In each race the team scoring the highest number of points is declared the winner of that specific race and awarded 1 team point. At the conclusion of the series the team having the highest number of team points will be declared the champion team. In the event of a tie for number of points, the team having the highest total race points accumulated during the series will be the winner.

Team Racing provides many exciting and interesting opportunities for helping the team cause by tactical maneuvering against members of the opposite team but within the applicable rules of the North American Yacht Racing Association.

Team Racing between Clubs has been popular for many years in Mid-western and Eastern yachting circles. Although the California Yacht Club sailors have engaged in many Match races, this will be their first experience in Team Racing. The Cleveland Yacht Club R fleet has been Team Racing against the Chicago Yacht Club R fleet for the past thirty years. Two of the six skippers representing Cleveland in this present series, Commodore Lee Wilson and J. Arthur Shomer,

Stan Miller to Discuss Racing Tactics

Stan Miller, one of the most respected sailboat racers on the West Coast, will address the members of the Del Rey Yacht Club at their clubhouse on Tuesday, March 7th, at 8 p.m. Members of other yacht clubs are invited to attend just by showing their yacht club card at the front door. The announcement was made by Mark Segal, DRYC Education Committee Chairman, and all meeting arrangements are being handled by Staff Commodore Bill Berger.

Mr. Miller was watch captain on *Debutante*, the fabulous Cal 36 that not only took first place in Class D in the recent Mazatlan Race, but went on to beat every other boat in the race, taking First Place Overall against the many big boats that competed in the 1500 mile marathon. Other Stan Miller laurels are: 1958 West Coast Thistle Champion, 1962 Lido 14 Champion and twice runner-up, and 1966 winner of the tough Alamitos Argosy in a Cal 40. One of his biggest feats took place in 1965 when he skippered a Cal 20 to second place against some of the finest competition in America in the One-Of-A-Kind Regatta in Florida.
